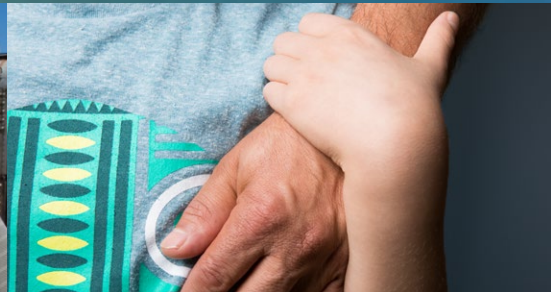

Who is eligible?

- ✓ Patients who have lived in the U.S. or its territories for more than 6 months
 - ✓ Those in one of the following insurance situations:
 - › Uninsured
 - › Patient's insurance plan excludes the Amgen medicine
 - ✓ Patients who demonstrate a financial need – household income at or below 500% of the federal poverty limit (FPL)
FPL amounts subject to change. Amounts for Alaska and Hawaii may vary from other states and are usually slightly higher.
 - ✓ Certain Medicare Part D patients with product coverage who cannot afford their out of pocket costs
- These patients must:
- › Demonstrate their inability to afford the medicine
 - › Not be eligible for Medicaid or Medicare's low-income subsidy (Extra Help)
 - › Satisfy all payer guidelines and Prior Authorization (PA) requirements prior to applying for assistance
 - › Not have any other financial support options
