A guide for physicians seeking prescription medicines from the Amgen Safety Net Foundation for their patients

Amgen Safety Net Foundation (ASNF) is a nonprofit patient assistance program that helps qualifying patients access Amgen medicines at no cost.

How does the prescription program work?

Under this model, physicians write a prescription for an eligible Amgen medicine to an enrolled ASNF patient and submit that prescription to the Foundation to be filled. Amgen prescription medicines are shipped directly to the patient, except for Prolia® which is shipped directly to the physician.

Request guidelines

- ✓ The prescription must be completed, signed and submitted with the patient application. This does not guarantee enrollment in or fulfillment of this prescription by ASNF.
- ✓ Once a patient has been enrolled, physicians can submit ongoing standalone prescriptions directly to ASNF.
